Kimberly and Richard attended the Goat Junior Livestock Clinic held at the Stanislaus County Fairgrounds. Here is what they had to say about the clinic.

“I learned a lot of useful tips at the goat livestock clinic including how to groom a goat properly and how to show and stand. I will apply all the things I learned at the clinic and take them into the show ring with me this year,” said **Kimberly**.

Richard reported, “At the Junior Livestock Clinic we learned about goats. We learned how to show, clip and judge a goat. We learned the important nutrients that a goat needs to stay alive. More people should go next year as it is educational and fun!”

Additionally, on Saturday, October 12, 2013, **Melissa** attended the Associated Feed Livestock Camp at Stanislaus County Fairgrounds and here is her report.

My focus when attending this camp was on Beef. I learned a lot of information on feed for the animals, what to feed them, how much to feed them, and even when to feed certain types of feed. They also did a great demonstration on fitting the steer. They went over step by step on how to fit your steer. One important thing I learned was that no two steers are the same so no two steers will have their hair cut exactly the same. I also learned some tips on showmanship like what to do and what not to do while showing. This camp was really helpful and full of information for a first year person like me. I really enjoyed it and look forward to going again next year!

The County Skate Event was held on October 28 at Golden Skate in San Ramon.

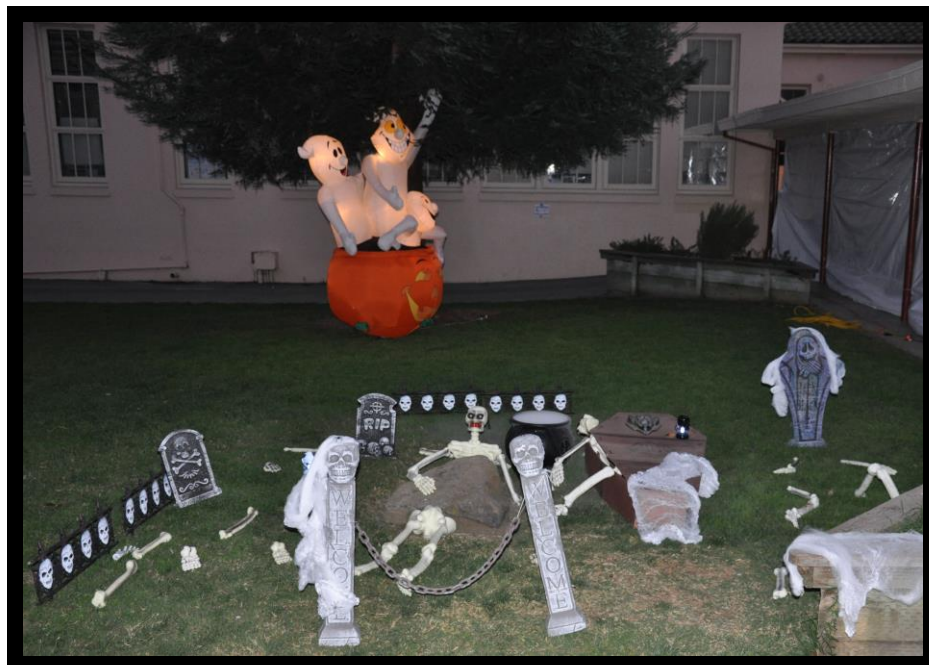
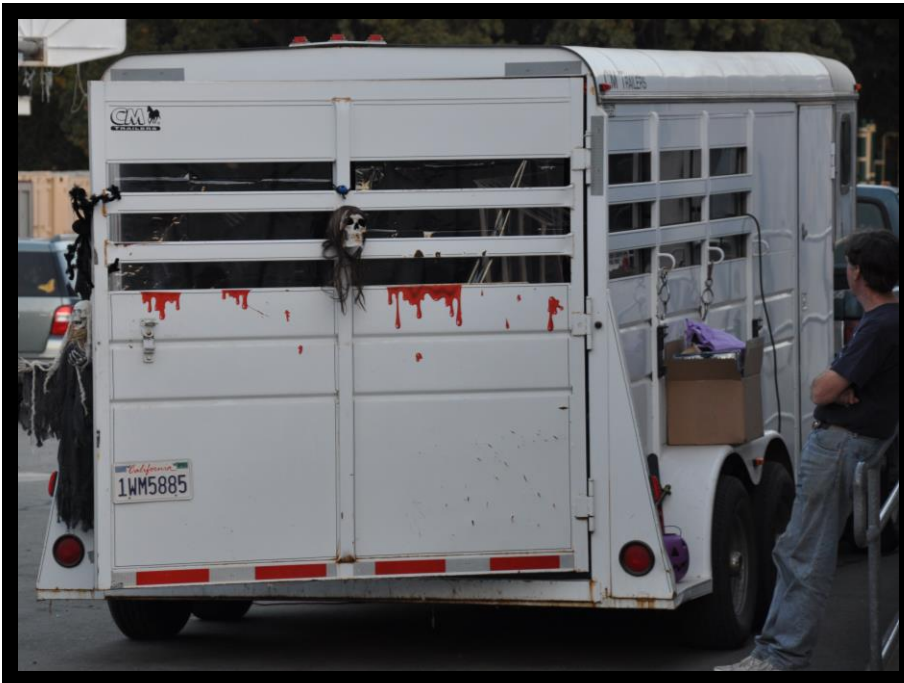
